### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Raghunath Girls' Post Graduate College is a premier women institution of Western Uttar Pradesh having multidisciplinary program in Humanities, Science, Commerce and Education with highly qualified faculty to cater to the students of any interdisciplinary courses. Our state and affiliating university has already adopted and implemented NEP-2020 from the session i.e., 2021-22. Multidisciplinary education has been introduced at graduation level from academic session 2021-22 in the state (G.O. No.1567/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011TC dated 13-7-21) • According to New Education Policy, It is mandatory for each student to opt at least one subject/paper (Major or Minor) from other faculty/discipline to ensure inter disciplinary learning. . Reskilling & reorientation of faculty is emphasised for the purpose of ensuring smooth transition of National Education Policy, by G.O. No.1267/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated15-6-21 ·The students now take the courses from more than one faculty for example science students are opting for at least one course from Arts or Commerce faculty and vice-versa. •Flexibility to change (with pre-requisite) any subject after one year is allowed at UG level. Students have the full freedom to opt any subject with some pre-requisite. . To ensure multidisciplinary education, there is no restriction to opt Minor/elective subject, because no prerequisite is needed for minor courses. A student who never studied science subject till12th level school education can also opt for that as minor elective paper at under graduate level. •Students are allowed to complete paper/course through recognized online (up to 20% of total credits of the course) platforms to ensure multidisciplinary (G.O. No.1065/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 20-4-21) ·Students of different colleges can also opt for their favourite subjects or courses from different colleges if not available in same college which truly ensures interdisciplinary system of education. (G.O. No.1065/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 20-4-21. Add-on, Skill Development & Capacity building Courses broaden the horizon of Multidisciplinary approach . NCC can also be opted as minor course at UG level which ensures interdisciplinary education. (G.O. No.1815/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 9-8-21). The college is inviting alumni, retired faculty, guest faculty, doing MoU's and Collaborations with other instututes (both academic & non-academic ) to facilitate this process. The research departments of the college

in future endeavours to undergo interdisciplinary and

multidisciplinary researches to find solutions to societies most pressing issues and challenges in collaboration with other Universities and non-government organisations.

### **16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

As per the letter no. 1816/sattar-3-2021 dated 09.08.2021 Uttar Pradesh State government has developed a state level Academic bank of Credit (ABC) software "ABACUS-UP" for credit Transfer of students and for facilitating their exit and re-entry. Raghunath Girls' Post Graduate College has registered itself through the website of ABACUSUP (http://abacus.upsdc.gov.in). It is activated and faculty and students are in the process of creating thier own profiles on the ABACUS.

#### 17.Skill development:

Skill development in higher education is instrumental in nation building by producing skilled and competent youth that can lead to economic growth, innovation, and social development. In the Higher education system, knowledge, and skill both are simultaneously required for diversity of employment needs in different fields. Therefore, Integration of vocational education programmes into mainstream higher education is focussed. Vocational skill has become a mandatory part of all UG curricula as per National Education Policy. Each student must opt for skill development course for first two years at UG level (G.O. No.1065/Sattar-3-2021-16(26)/2011 dated 20-4-21). College successfully ran 20 skill development courses approved by the University in the session 2023-24 such as:- 1. Fundamental of CAD and CAM (V0001007) College offers these 20 "Skill Development/Vocational Courses" in campus physically. Unlimited skill courses are available online for students through MOOCs, which can also be opted by

students of the college as Skill/vocational development course, which is the part of curriculum according to NEP. The college also offerered "Value-Added Courses" in the session 2023-24. These were designed to enhance the standard of the students beyond the levels specified in the curriculum. These courses not only benefit the students by imparting additional information of the subject which is not taught as main subject but also teaches the basic and required knowledge of the subject. The Capacity Building & Value-added courses conducted in the session were also for the enhancement of employability of the students. Industry Academia Integration and Skill Development Cell is established in all HEIs of UP (G.O. No.142/Sattar-3-2021-8(35)/2020TC1 dated 15-1-21) State Vocational (Skill) courses policy for HEIs is also released. (G.O. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-8-21) Each HEIs have to sign MoU for internship, Training (G.O. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-8-21). Our college has signed Memorandum of Understanding with 31 Skill partners, Industries, other academic institutes, NGOs, publication houses, companies and related bodies which have agreed to take part in skill-based training of the Skill Development courses (offered by our college) to the students of our college. These skill partners not only participate in training but also evaluate our students based on their practical assessment and provides certificates of the training. This is truly fulfilling the aim of New Education Policy of integration of Skill and Formal Education. Skill courses are designed as per NSQF guidelines (G.O. No.1969/Sattar-3-2021 dated 18-8-21). Skill courses are advised to be designed as per local needs and facilities. Internship/ apprenticeship/ Training/ Hands on training is a mandatory part of skill course and it will be completed during vacation or before/ after college hours, so mainstream classes are not affected. Skill oriented part of each subject is highlighted in syllabus also. At early exit (Certificate, Diploma) student will exit with specific title of their subjects, so that they can work in this field. The assessment system of skill development courses is mainly based on the practical training, therefore, 60% of students' assessment is based on skill part and done by skill partner based on Internship/ apprenticeship/ Training. The skill development courses can either be only one single course, referred to as independent or can be progressive in nature, which are offered serially in progressive semesters for specialization in one skill. A student can choose different skill courses in different semesters or can specialize in one single skill. 2 Units of NCC aim to instil a sense of comradeship, patriotism & discipline in the cadets, thereby inculcating incredible skills and officer's qualities through trainings. Social entrepreneurship via community engagement is facilitated by NSS & Ranger volunteers through a number of extension & outreach

activities conducted under their umbrella.

### 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The institution since inception has been successfully running full time approved courses in languages i.e., English, Hindi and Sanskrit. For transmissionof cultural heritage, it is running courses in Music, History, Philosophy, Drawing & painting. For appropriate integration of Indian Language system, college has registered itself on Swayam Portal (Local Chapter) for online teaching course (College Id-4582). Now the college is also in the process of registering itself in MOOCs and other government and nongovernment bodies for integrated teaching Indian language and culture with online courses especially in Fine Arts, Sanskrit, hindi, Music etc. The faculty and students of Sanskrit department participate every year in "Vyasa Samaroh" since 1992 conducted by department of Sanskrit, C.C.S. University, Meerut, starting from Bhai Dooj for one week to preserve and promote Sanskrit language and Indian Culture and heritage of Vedic Era. The college has established a History Museum in September 2003 that has archaeological material of historical significance from various sites of Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan etc. It has rare manuscript paintings of 16th -18th century AD, rare paintings of Buddhists Art of China, Indian coins from 2nd Century BC to early 20th Century, Indian paintings from 600 AD to 1900 AD(Replicas) of Ajanta, Mughal, Rajasthan, Pahari and Deccan manuscripts and paintings. In addition it has charts and photographs depicting historical sites, images, artifacts, inscriptions, coins, arms, armour jewelleries etc. It is enriched with books and booklets on archaeology, musicology, history & culture. For online depiction of historical heritage and culture of India and neighbouring countries, the museum is assisted with E-classroom as well. Our College Library has a corner catering to the books dealing with Indian Knowledge system. Navgraha Vatika in our college premises foster integration of Indian Knowledge System in the learning horizon.

#### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

With the implementation of NEP-2020, the college is focusing on the knowledge and skills students acquire at the end of a program or courses. After the completion of a lecture, learners are encouraged to interact with peers and clear doubts with faculty members. Activities in or outside the classroom are designed in a manner to help students to achieve their learning outcomes. The course outcomes(CO), Program Outcomes(PO), Program Specific Outcomes(PSO) and Program Educational Objectives(PEO) are clearly discussed with

the students to help them accomplish their goals. The outcome based education would allow the learner to transfer their credit and switch to another institution that is accredited with OBE syllabus. Focus on OBE would create greater emphasis on vocational training, flexible degrees and competency based programs. The institution is working on it in a positive way. In the academic year 2022-23, our college fully embraced the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, implementing it across the second year in all faculties. The focus shifted towards providing skill-oriented and value-based education, emphasizing achievement of learning outcomes. Students were given the freedom to choose multidisciplinary subjects from any facultyarts, science, or commerce promoting a collaborative learning approach. The objective was to ensure holistic development through creative, experiential & project-based education that addresses realworld issues. The teaching methodology incorporated projectbased learning, excursions, ICT usage, educational visits, practical sessions, and internships. The college proactively integrates professional courses such as B.Ed into its academic offerings, focusing on cultivating advanced teaching methodologies and skills. As an integral component of the curriculum, the faculty orchestrates internship programs designed to deliver hands-on, practical training, thereby honing the students' expertise. Moreover, the college actively supports students in securing employment opportunities by facilitating connections with the job market. The program outcomes for Airlines Tourism and Hospitality Management are designed to cultivate a cadre of professionals poised for excellence. Graduates and Diploma holders emerge as ambassadors of exceptional customer service, adjusted to the multifaceted needs within the dynamic domains of airlines, tourism, and hospitality. Empowered with managerial proficiency, students master the art of optimizing operational facets, elevating efficiency, and ensuring customer satisfaction. We also integrate skill and vocational education into the general education system, enabling students to acquire industry-relevant skills. In the 2021-22 session, various departments designed 19 new skill courses, mandatory for students to take in the first two years. The courses, available online or offline, offer flexibility in completing credits. The college fostered partnerships with NGOs, institutions, and private organizations through MoUs, facilitating practical classes, shortterm training, and internships. This system was also followed in current session and more MoU related to these courses were signed for effective implementation of these courses. The college also conduct research activities through PhD Program in different subject of Arts, Science and Commerce. The outcomes of the programme is to inculcate Mastery of Advanced Scientific Knowledge, contribute to the body of scientific knowledge through original research, making

meaningful and innovative contributions to their field. Research Scholar will demonstrate a high level of pedagogical expertise, incorporating innovative teaching methodologies and strategies. They will be prepared for leadership roles in education and will integrate research findings into their teaching practices, ensuring a dynamic and informed approach to education. In the current academic year college introduced five value added courses. The program outcomes of value added courses are strategically designed to impart additional skills and knowledge that complement and enhance the overall educational experience. These courses aim to provide students with practical skills, augmenting their core academic expertise. Students adopting these value-added courses will emerge with a diverse skill set, making them well-rounded professionals capable of addressing realworld challenges. The outcomes include heightened adaptability, improved problem-solving abilities, and enhanced communication skills. Moreover, students will gain a competitive edge in the job market, as these courses are tailored to align with current industry trends and demands. Overall, the value-added courses not only enrich the academic journey but also empower students to navigate the complexities of their chosen fields with confidence and competence. The programme outcome of National Cadet Core, National Service Scheme and Ranger are to develop the leadership quality among youth, emphasis on discipline, team spirit, develop a sense of responsibility, inculcation of values such as courage, selflessness, and integrity. These programmes promote the personality development, community engagement, environment sustainability, nationality among youth and promotes a sense of social responsibility, survival skills and civic consciousness. To guide students in career-related matters, the college established a Career Counselling and Placement Cell. Workshops, webinars, seminars, and short-term training programs were organized to enhance soft and specialized skills. Following NEP 2020, the college implemented a multiple exit and entry system, allowing students to drop and resume courses without losing academic progress. The Academic Bank of Credits System (ABACUS) was adopted for efficient credit management. College transfers the credits of students who completed online skill courses as per state Government and university guidelines. UP Government has developed a portal namely UP Digital library to facilitate contents of higher education online. To promote use of ICT in education initially upto 20% online education is permitted in each programme. Credits earned through Government./UGC recognized online courses are permitted to be added/transferred by all HEIs. A fast learner can earn credits from recognized online courses and complete his/her degree programme earlier.. Any student can use them for online education purpose.' In the wake of the evolving landscape of education, our college

printers, 15 projectors, 3 visualizers, 26 laptops, and 285 desktop computers, college is well-equipped for digital learning. Wi-Fi routers and access points are installed across the campus, allowing easy internet access for both faculty and students.

Smart classrooms enable teachers to share websites, videos, and other relevant content quickly, while some instructors share eBooks and digital resources through Telegram, WhatsApp, college's YouTube channel, and Learning Management Systems. RGPG College, an affiliated institution of Chaudhary Charan Singh University, Meerut, follows university-level examination and evaluation norms. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP), the college ensures a rigorous and transparent internal assessment system for both undergraduate and postgraduate students. Students are informed about the internal evaluation schedule through orientation programs, the college website, mentor-mentee relationships, and WhatsApp groups, ensuring transparency and preparation in advance.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

#### **4.1 - Physical Facilities**

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The College offers comprehensive infrastructure and facilities to support high-quality teaching, learning, and holistic student development. The campus features 58 classrooms and 44 laboratories (comp. labs, including specialized spaces like two instrumental rooms and three departmental museums in Zoology and History. It is well-equipped with 285 computers, 14 projectors, and 84 CCTV cameras for security. A centrally air-conditioned staff room and a well-furnished auditorium with IT facilities enhance the academic environment.

Each department is provided with a dedicated library, staff room, computers, printers, and internet access. Specialized equipment, such as visualizers in the Zoology and Botany departments, is available, with the Zoology department offering an air-conditioned research lab. The skill development centre includes a computer lab with 98 computers, internet connectivity, and an E-board, alongside an English language lab.

Additionally, the History Museum showcases replicas, miniature paintings, and rare coins, while the B.Voc (Yoga) program includes specialized labs for Naturopathy, Hydrotherapy, Mud Therapy, and Shatkarm. The Central Library houses over 1 lakh books, rare texts including IKS and journals, and provides access to e-journals through platforms like INFLIBNET, DELNET, and N-LIST. The robust physical infrastructure and online infrastructure (LMS- Pragyan) fosters an enriching learning environment and promotes overall student growth.

Outdoor options feature Multipurpose 2 grass grounds available for kabaddi (grass area:  $18 \times 6$ ), Volleyball, and Basketball court (18\*15) with uprights and fibre shooting board.one side stairs with 6 rows for players and audience.

Gymnasium and Yoga Labs: The campus offers a well-equipped gymnasium and yoga labs, which include hydrotherapy and mud therapy facilities, guided by trained instructors.

Hockey and Athletics: Students have access to Kailash Prakash Stadium for hockey and athletics.

Practice Areas: Hostel grounds provide open spaces for student practice, performances, and rehearsals.

The library at Raghunath Girls' Post Graduate College (RGPGC) serves as a hub for academic and research excellence, accommodating 160 readers. With a vast collection of over 1,00,000 books, journals, encyclopaedias, dictionaries, atlases, yearbooks, magazines, and newspapers. it provides a comprehensive resource base for diverse disciplines. Students also benefit from access to online academic resources in the library's dedicated reading room.

Fully automated since 2004, the library uses Alice ILMS software (version 6.0) for efficient management. Its Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) allows users to easily search and retrieve resources. Key modules include the database maintenance module, which supports tasks like record updates, indexing, and printing accession registers, and the circulation module, which handles issuing, returning, and renewing books, tracks membership profiles with photographs, and sends overdue reminders.

The library connects users to over 6,000 e-journals and 1,64,000 e-books via the N-List program of INFLIBNET, DELNET, and CCSU's digital library. Additionally, 628 rare and previously unavailable books have been digitized, further enriching academic opportunities for students and faculty. With its state-of-the-art facilities and vast resources, the library is central to fostering research and learning at RGPGC.

Raghunath Girls' Post Graduate College (RGPGC) has developed a robust ICT infrastructure to support modern education and administrative functions. The college operates three servers with 1 Gbps internet speed and firewall protection, ensuring secure and high-speed connectivity. It offers 285 desktop computers and 26

laptops, providing ample technological resources for students and faculty.

To meet documentation and administrative needs, 45 printer-cumscanner devices are distributed across departments, offices, and the library. The college features 17 smart classrooms, nine classrooms with LCD facilities, and three seminar rooms. The auditorium, equipped with a full-stage screen, LCD multimedia projector, and laptops, supports large-scale presentations and events. Specialized learning is enhanced with three visualizers in designated departments.

The library operates with 15 desktop systems, two printer-cumscanners, RFID-enabled book handling, and the ALICE Library Management Software, ensuring efficient resource management. A Local Area Network (LAN) connects classrooms, laboratories, administrative offices, and seminar rooms, facilitating seamless communication and resource sharing across the campus.

Additionally, the college provides essential software like MS Office, OpenOffice, and regularly updated antivirus programs. This comprehensive ICT infrastructure reflects RGPGC's commitment to fostering a technology-driven environment that enhances teaching, learning, and administrative efficiency.

Raghunath Girls' Post Graduate College (RGPGC) has well-structured procedures to ensure the maintenance and enhancement of its infrastructure. Maintenance tasks are managed by external agencies, approved by Finance Committee, Maintenance Committee and Chief Administrative Officer. Teacher-in-charges oversee departmental consumables, while practical departments and the library are maintained by dedicated staff.

Key areas of maintenance include:

- Computer Hardware: Desktops and laptops, equipped with antivirus software, are serviced through an AMC with M/s Computer Links.
- Electrical Maintenance: Two on-site electricians handle electrical repairs and generator upkeep.
- Essential Facilities: RO systems, water tanks, CCTV cameras,

- AC units and Lift undergo regular servicing.
- Library and Sports: The library committee ensures stock verification and book upkeep, while the sports committee manages the maintenance of sports and recreational facilities.
- Lab AMC

Sanitary amenities, including dustbins and vending machines, are placed across campus to promote hygiene. A dedicated cleaning staff ensures campus cleanliness. Student facilities include a supervised canteen, a relaxation corner, and a 250-bed hostel managed by experienced wardens.

To support sustainability, the college has implemented rainwater recharge systems, solar water heaters, and solar-powered lights. These initiatives, coupled with effective maintenance practices, ensure smooth operations and enhance the well-being of the college community.

The institution has established a robust performance monitoring and appraisal system for both teaching and non-teaching staff to ensure ongoing improvement and accountability. The institution's

performance appraisal system, combined with student feedback, cultivates a culture of accountability, excellence, and continuous growth.

Faculty evaluation includes maintaining departmental diaries and self-assessment forms, where faculty document their teaching, academic activities, administrative duties, and extracurricular contributions. These are verified by IQAC and reviewed by the Principal. Raghunath Girls' P.G. College ensures transparency and accountability in its financial management through a rigorous process of internal and external audits.

Internal audit is conducted annually to verify the accuracy of its financial records. The process involves a multi-tiered review by the Accounts Officer, Chief Administrative Officer, and Principal.

Purchase procedures are adhered to, with quotations and price comparisons ensured by Finance Committee. The internal audits are overseen by qualified Chartered Accountants, approved by both the Governing Body and University. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, V.S. Gupta & Co., Meerut, conducted the audit, reviewing balance sheets, general fund income, and payments. Discrepancies noted are promptly addressed with appropriate documentation, and the final audited reports are submitted to the college authorities for review.

External audits are conducted by auditors appointed by the Uttar Pradesh Government, ensuring compliance with state regulations. The most recent external audit affirmed adherence to government guidelines. College prepares Utilization Certificates for all grants given by central and state government, ensuring proper allocation of funds according to specified expenditure heads and submit them in a timely manner.

This dual-audit system reflects the institution's commitment to financial discipline, optimal resource utilization, and the highest standards of transparency and accountability.

Raghunath Girls' P.G. College employs a diverse funding model, securing maximum funding from various public and private sources including contributions from the college trust as well. Additional revenue is generated through specific components of student fees for regular, self-financed, add-on, capacity-building, research initiatives and skill courses. Income is also derived from leasing campus facilities, such as a stationery photocopy shop, vehicle stand, NTT office, canteen, and mess.

College receives contributions from government agencies, private donors, alumnae and teaching staff to facilitatescholarships and fee concessions to students. Raghunath Girls' P.G. College has implemented a comprehensive waste management system focused on sustainability and environmental responsibility. Biodegradable, horticultural dry and wet waste are processed and used for gardening through vermicomposting (Dhara-Gold) and bio-composting (Jivamrit), This year vermicomposting yielded 455 kg of compost. Recyclable inorganic waste, such as glass and plastic, is collected and properly disposed of via municipal vans, while newspapers and posters are annually recycled through the Vasudha Eco-Club. Segregated dry and wet waste is collected in designated blue and green dustbins.

To minimize plastic waste, the college has banned single-use plastics, and all segregated plastic waste is collected monthly by the Vasudha Eco-Club for recycling by the Save-Mother-Earth Mission team. Two Sanitary pad incinerators are available in in the college

premises. Burning of leaves and branches is also prohibited. The college promotes liquid waste management with a well-functioning sewer system and has installed four rainwater recharge systems and borewells to conserve water. Additionally, e-waste is accumulated in an e-waste room and sent to a registered vendor for processing according to government guidelines.

College fosters environmental awareness through various activities led by the NCC, NSS and departments, encouraging the community to engage in waste reduction and recycling practices.
