Green Protocol of the College

- Reduce the use of disposable items in all functions and marriages.

- Adopt and promote power saving electrical equipments such as LED Bulbs and solar power equipments such as lights, geysers.
- Promote use of e-copies, e-assignments and e-documents to minimize use of paper.
- Plantation of trees on important day of celebration.
- Promote organic vegetable and medicinal plant cultivation. Promote Biocompost/vermicompost unit on and off the campus.
- Support and protect indigenous diversity and their documentation.
- Ban on the use of single use plastic in canteen and in all the meetings of the college.
- Conduct awareness programs and workshops on the harmful impact of single use plastic.
- Encourage students to spread importance of banning plastic, water and energy conservation, waste management in the community they live.
