**SWOT ANALYSIS  
OF THE COLLEGE**

**Strengths:**

1. 90% of the teaching faculty members (both permanent and temporary) are Ph.D. holders. Therefore a high level of research oriented culture exists in the college.
2. Ever since NET, SLET and pre-Ph.D. entrance have become a compulsory requirement for seeking a teaching career in the higher education services the teachers concentrate upon the aspiring PG students in channelizing their academic energies towards these competitions along with their university degree exams.
3. Every student who takes admission here, no matter what her earlier education background has been becomes an expert in the use of computer and internet facility.
4. More than 60% of students come from a rural background where opportunities to brush up their speaking and writing skills are less. Keeping this in mind, the college has established language labs both in English & Hindi and courses like Communicative English and Journalism are taught here to encourage girls to enrich their communicative skills.
5. The spirit of inclusiveness can be seen in the mutual social conduct of students and teachers because work, diligence and dedication are the three personality assets of this college. There is no differentiation in behaviour on the basis of caste, community or economic status even in the administrative staff and the 4<sup>th</sup> class employees of the college.
6. The college is centrally located in the town and within 2 km range from the three bus stands which makes it easily accessible to the girls.
7. It has a large hostel, parents of students from distant cities feel very safe in leaving their wards here.
8. College has matched with the latest developments in IT methods of teaching and learning.
9. College has initiated a good number of add-on courses.
10. A very strong and award receiving Sports and Physical Education Department.
11. High quality research programmes have been promoted, mainly in the practical departments who have high quality laboratory arrangements.
12. Internet teaching and learning process has been initiated.
13. Latest audio-visual equipments are made available to the students
14. National collaborations with NSDC, NIIT, TCS, IIFT and Nationalise Banks such as Union Bank of India.

1. Developing a career-oriented approach in the girls in accordance with the ever growing need for women-self-dependence.
2. Motivating the parents to allow choices of courses to their daughters according to the latter's aptitude and interest instead of forcing long-tested traditional courses upon them.
3. Getting all the vacant posts of teaching staff permanently filled so that the departments may function without a break and give better results.

## 1.1 CURRICULUM PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION:

### **Vision of the College:**

“To produce such professionals who have global competence, vision & skills as are necessary to meet the challenges of emerging global knowledge economy by the power of innovation, creativity & efficient learning ability.”

### **Mission of the College:**

1. To focus on holistic development of the girls
2. To educate the rural masses unto the last
3. To encourage the education of economically disadvantaged group
4. To strive for academic excellence
5. To enable the students to keep pace with the latest technology
6. To inculcate and develop orientation towards Research

The college communicates to the students, its vision, mission and objectives through its website, students’ orientation programmes and department-wise fresher’s functions. The Principal discusses them with the teachers in regular staff meetings held at the beginning, mid-session and at the end of each academic session. She holds discussions with the Heads of the departments before every academic and extra-curricular activity is finalized for the session. The non-teaching staff keeps in constant contact with the Principal and the teaching staff for making and taking administrative decision and action for the college. The Management is in continuous touch with the Principal to keep its information up-to-date to confirm that the college is being run in pursuance of its vision, mission and objectives. The college has a very active alumni association which holds yearly meets in the college. Its members keep directly in touch with their respective departments and assist them in ways required and possible by them. The IQAC team plays the role of a connecting chord between the Principal and the teaching staff, between the teaching and the non-teaching staff and among the various stake-holders of the institution.

The College forms its year-wise academic and extra-curricular action plan in the form of College-Calendar for every new session before the last session completes the University examination process and it is declared in the last staff meeting before the college closes down for the summer vacations. All the important issues, events and initiatives to be taken are discussed thread-bare and a collective view is taken upon it. If any alterations and changes are proposed they are taken into consideration and the final action-plan is formed and the updated College-Calendar is announced on the opening day of the new session in the staff-meeting. The departments set their departmental schedules in accordance with the College-Calendar. For example, they organize their academic seminars and extra-curricular activities keeping in mind the internal examinations dates. The departments also mutually discuss the dates of their national and international conferences so that there is no overlapping and students may benefit from inter-departmental progressive activities.

The University’s Boards of Studies set the course-curriculum for all the prescribed subjects which the teachers have to follow in teaching their

students. Some senior teachers are called as experts by the Boards to assist in their respective subjects' curriculum revision and change. The setting of question papers for the final university exams is the responsibility of the University and we get them in the beginning of the examination schedule from it. All are college faculty members with five years of teaching experience are authorized university paper-setters, but final selection and printing of papers is done by the University academic staff. Date-sheets for the university exams are also announced by the University. Subject experts' names are sent by the University for conducting Viva-Voce exams for PG students and practical exams for UG /PG students and our college staff contacts them and confirms with them their dated of holding these exams in our college.

University examination copies are centrally checked at various centres of the University Campus by college teachers and combined results are declared at the University internet portal only. Hard copies of students' mark-sheets are sent to the respective colleges later. The Convocation programme is also organized centrally by the University each year in the month of December where college students receive their certificates and degrees. Since the last four years the students aiming for Ph.D. research work also have to sit for an entrance exam organized by the university. Their RDC were formed and registration meetings were earlier also held at the University only.

Now the choice of Guides, six months' compulsory pre-Ph.D. courses are also planned and organized by the University. They are held in the respective campus departments and only if a subject is not being taught in the campus or the department is still not fully developed departments in associate colleges are deputed to organize classes for these courses. For example our college is organizing pre-Ph.D. classes in Music and Home Sc.

The college has provided the teachers with the latest audio-visual teaching infra-structure and tools. All departments have their own lap-tops and desk tops for teachers and students. Each department has its own seminar room with latest smart board facilities and an internet connection to assist the teachers in disseminating latest and contemporary information and knowledge to the students. The PG internal exams' dates are set by the college in consultation with the HODs. The college purchases text books, reference books, journals and now e-journals and e-books also on consultation and demand of the departments form the aids it gets for the same for its Central Library. Each teacher holds her College Library account and can take books for the whole academic session. Every department also has its own sumptuous library with books that are lent to students as well.

#### **Teaching-Learning and Evaluation:**

The college interacts with the University and works on its directives right from the admission process of the students (as now the admissions are organized directly by the University portal) to the conducting of examination and declaration of results. Our college teachers take part in the national and international seminars and conferences organized by various departments of

the university. They also attend Orientation and Refresher programmes in the respective campus departments and in other state and national universities as the requirement and facility arises. Various departments have direct connections, interactions and combined programmes with NGOs and industries related to their subjects and fields of activities. The Doctoral and Post Doctoral research scholars receive funds from various Government bodies like UGC, ICSSR, ICPR, etc. to assist them in their research programmes. (Details are being given in individual department's achievement report).

Faculty members of the departments of Political Science, Home Science, Sanskrit and Sociology were conveners and Advisory members of the Board of Studies and assisted in the formation of UG and PG curriculum. They contribute in its development according to the demands of the changing expectations from higher education in the society and the college in particular. The students' and teachers' feedbacks are given to the university subject experts when they come to visit the departments as examiners. ICT, Communicative English, Physical Education, Computer Application, Food Sc. were subjects added to the University curriculum as a result of efforts in the same direction.

The course-curriculum of vocational courses added in the UGC Community College programme (Office Automation & E-Governance and now BPO) and in Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Kaushal Kendra (B. Voc. in IT, Yogic Science and Clinical Psychology) in 2014-15 and 2015-16 have been developed by the college faculty members of the related subjects and they have been passed by the Boards of Studies formed by the University.

Apart from the yearly and semester-wise evaluation organized by the University the college holds internal exams (quiz and hourly) to assess the progress made in the learning of the students. The departments also organize academic seminars in which students' compulsory participation is ensured to judge their grasping ability and interests created in the curriculum imparted to them in class-room lectures and applied education programmes (through exhibitions, rallies, written assignments, debates and extempore presentations).

Two skill development courses are offered as optional subjects in UG:

1. Food Sc. & Quality Control
2. Computer Application.
3. We started some Diplomas and Certificate courses in IT with the help of NIIT in 2012.
4. We have started a Community College Program (permission granted by the UGC) in our college in 2-14-15. The following one year diploma has been introduced in partnership with TCS:  
Diploma in Office Automation & E-Governance
5. Now a Diploma in BPO has also been initiated under the same scheme.

Following three Bachelors Vocational Degree Programmes have been initiated this year in 2015-16 under Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Kaushal Scheme

6. B. Voc in IT

7. B. Voc. in Applied Clinical Psychology

8. B. Voc. in Yogic Science

9. Nursery Teachers Training course (NTT) is also offered by the college to students aiming at Nursery school jobs.

10. Diploma and Certificate courses in Acupressure are also offered.

We have started a Special Study Centre for Women of IGNOU in our college since 2012 which offers UG / PG Degree Diploma and Certificate courses for students who are doing their UG / PG courses in traditional courses from our college. IGNOU offers correspondence courses whose degrees may be simultaneously obtained along with the CCS University Degrees.

Our University has not started the Choice Based Credit System as yet. So we do not have the categorization of Core and Elective courses. Therefore, neither do we have the facility of courses offered in modular form, credit transfer and accumulation nor of lateral and vertical mobility within and across programmes and courses.

But we offer 20 courses as option to the UG students and 15 courses as option to the PG students in the Arts stream. We have 4 options for UG students and 3 options for PG students in the Science stream. We offer both UG and PG degrees in the Commerce stream (B.Com. and M.Com.) And we run a UG Degree programme in Education (B.Ed.) also. The UG students have to appear in Foundation as well as Qualifying courses each year in their three years of degree programme.

As informed earlier, along with the elective options given by the University our college gives two more vocational course options to the UG students: one in Food Science & Quality Control and the other in Computer Application. The skill development add-on courses and the vocational courses mentioned earlier in point number may be taken in the category of Enrichment courses.

Our college offers self-financed U.G. programmes in Education and Commerce (B.Ed. & B.Com.) It also offers self-financed PG programmes in Arts and Science sections - (M.A. in Geography, Home Science, M. Sc. in Botany and Chemistry and M.Com.) Admissions, curriculum, fee-structure and teacher qualifications are set by the University according to the UGC norms. Students are registered directly on the University portal and merit lists are formed by it and sent to us with the students' names. Admissions are to be confirmed by us at the University portal again on the same dates we complete them at our end. The teachers are appointed by experts nominated by the University. The pattern of their salary is also set by the University.

All the skill oriented programmes offered by the college are relevant to regional and global employment market. The IT based Degrees and Diplomas like B. Voc. in IT, NIIT programmes and Computer Application course make the students eligible to seek IT based appointments anywhere globally. B. Voc. in BPO will help them get jobs in MNC's BPOs in our country. B. Voc.

in Applied Clinical Psychology will enable them to become counselors in hospitals and nursing homes in departments of clinical psychology. Yogic Science is the most sought after science in the international arena. Students with degrees in Yogic Science will be able to obtain jobs as Yoga Instructors anywhere in the world.

The Special Study Centre for Women of IGNOU in our college provides flexibility to the students of combining the conventional class room lecture based courses with the Distance Learning programmes to choose the courses from both and obtain two parallel degrees or a degree and diploma simultaneously, one from the CCS University and one from IGNOU. It benefits the students in two ways. Those who have not been able to get admissions in our college due to low percentage get it in IGNOU and as the college teachers are also the counsellors of IGNOU these students get the benefit of learning from them only help in the week-end classes. Secondly, those students who do not get subject combinations of their choice in UG courses due to low merit or in PG courses due to seat unavailability are able to select subjects of their choice in IGNOU to pursue the career of their choice later on. The institution also benefits by offering those courses which are not available to it in the regular capacity. For example we do not have M.A. in Philosophy and in Public Administration. IGNOU offers both. This helps us to keep our meritorious students in our college only for post graduate studies. Similarly, students who take Home Sc. as one of their three options in B.A. and score well continue with us in Diploma courses of Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) and Diploma in Nutrition and Health Education (DNHE). Many of them then move on to our self-finance course of M.Sc. in Home Sc.

### **1.3 CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT:**

We have tried to supplement the University prescribed courses by introducing the earlier mentioned add-on courses which help our students in developing their skills in self-employment and in becoming globally competent professionals. Those students who opt for these courses along with the traditional degree programmes develop the capabilities of coping with the needs of the ever changing employment arena.

All the extension activities programmes concentrate upon the environment issue. Rangers, NSS, NCC, Community Development Cell, even the faculty members from various disciplines organize rallies, poster competitions, seminars, workshops, street plays and debates upon this issue. Ours being a girls' institution we realize that if a girl is made aware of pollution and environment imbalance problem she will inculcate the 'save and clean environment' culture in a whole family and the coming generation of children. The college has an independent Beautification & Gardening Committee whose in-charge and members are the HODs of the Botany, Zoology and Home Science departments. The Bursar of the college takes their expert opinion to guide the gardeners and cleaners in the college. We have a Plant Conservation

Society where medicinal plants are cultivated, a Botanical garden, one Lotus-flower fountain and one Hydrilla-flower fountain and a Nutri-Garden all maintained with natural manure system.

Students of Food Science & Quality Control are sent for “one month on the job training” in different food industries. Home science students are taken to different Textile industries and Tinned food factories for Industrial visit. Chemistry students are taken to visit different drugs, Chemicals, sugar, leather etc industries. Drawing & Painting students are taken to different art Galleries. Zoology students are taken to Fisheries farms. Pol. Science students are brought into direct contact with *Sabhasads*, MLAs and M.Ps of the area through seminars and panel discussions organized in our college.

We use pedagogic strategies to encourage gender sensitization through debates, panel discussions, street plays, guest lectures by nationally and internationally known personalities.

Recently, we had organized an international panel discussion on position of women in society in comparison with the position of women in the world.

We also had organized a national seminar on women’s human rights issue sponsored by NHRC.

Ours being a women’s college the faculty members continue to sensitize the students regularly during their class room lectures and one to one discussions with the students.

Community Development Cell organized talks, competitions, rallies, *Nukkad Naataks* (Street Plays) and social service campaigns on topics and places related to Old Age, AIDS, Status of Women, Disabled and Blind Children, Orphanages, Environment & *Swachchhta Abhiyan* (Cleaning Campaigns). The NSS & NCC Cadets joins hands with the college students in all the above drives from time to time.

#### **1.4 FEEDBACK SYSTEM:**

Regular meetings of students’ representatives of the following committees are organized with the Principal, IQAC members, teaching, administrative and management bodies of the college to track the progress of these committees in making honest and genuine student support system available in the college for the fair progress students. Leaders of the Students’ Union; Student representatives of the Proctors’ Board; Student Members of the Student Welfare Association; Members of the Career Counselling & Academic Cell; Student Members of the Hostel Committee; Sports-Women; Canteen Committee; Medical Aid Committee; Grievance Cell; Cultural & Literary Programmes Committee. A grievance box is made available to the students outside the Grievance Cell office to define their problems and give their suggestions uninhibited and in writing which are weekly read by the Cell and discussed with the Principal and IQAC members for their redressal. The P.G. students find a very conducive atmosphere in their respective departments and usually find full support from the faculty members in solving their academic, social and personal problems. The Principal’s office is always open to the

students without any restrictions and they interact with her with full confidence requesting support and advice for their requirements and problems.

**CRITERION II:  
TEACHING-LEARNING  
AND EVALUATION**

### **2.1 STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND PROFILE:**

Admissions of UG & PG students in traditional courses are done through online registration directly at the University portal. So, the applications are sent on line to the University with the first, second and third choice options and not to the colleges.

The University makes the merit list and sends it to our college according to the preference of the students and in numbers sanctioned for our college.

Our admission committee checks their originals and helps them in choosing the subjects of their choice according to their merit and availability of seats in our departments.

The entire process is transparent and computerized for future MIS requirements. Students are directly registered at the University portal and merit list is sent to us of the number of students equal to the seats allotted to our college. In all the last four years all the allotted seats in all the courses have been filled. Therefore, we may say that the Demand Ratio is at par with the admissions.

### **2.2 CATERING TO STUDENT DIVERSITY:**

Economically weak students are helped in several ways, viz. by giving the scholarships, lending books to them and enrolling them in the 'earn while you learn' programmes.

Special efforts are made to arrange classes in the ground floor class rooms for make the physically challenged students. Photocopies of class notes are also made available to them by their class fellows under the supervision of the teachers if they are not able to reach the college and their classrooms regularly and on time.

The college organizes monthly tests for students of U.G. classes and marked assignments & paper presentation exercises for evaluating the students of P.G. classes.

Those students of P.G. classes who do not perform well in the internal theory examinations are made to write assignments and present papers on topics of difficulty. Special tutorial classes are arranged for them. Teachers discuss their problems on one to one basis also.

The provision of back papers is also given by the University to students who fail in the regular exams usually arranged before the next annual and semester examinations for them to make-up. They are given provisional admissions in the next year and are promoted subject to their passing in the back paper exams.

Those students who outshine others and obtain higher marks are singled out to assist the weaker students. They share their notes and also explain the difficult topics to them before and after the teachers deliver their lectures.

Each department keeps a record of the marks obtained by its students. They are shown their copies and their signatures are taken on them to let them know their good and weak points so that they are able to prepare well for the final annual and semester examinations. They are also prepared to face viva voce exams by taking their rehearsal oral exams and interviews.

### **2.3 TEACHING-LEARNING PROCESS:**

The College Academic Calendar for the new session is distributed to all the departments in the first staff meeting of the session. The departments then plan their schedule accordingly and place the tentative programmes list with dates and months on their respective notice boards for the students to prepare for the internal papers and practical exams, in advance. These notices are then sent to other departments to mutually plan interdepartmental competitive academic and extension activities without any clash of dates. The teachers' and students' attendance sheets are also sent on line to the regional and state government higher services department in Meerut and Allahabad on a monthly and bi-monthly basis.

To make learning more student-centric we have developed a tradition of forming departmental students' associations by electing student representatives and then giving them different posts. The College also elects its students' union every year with the assistance of the Student Welfare Association. The representatives of these two bodies keep very active and vigilant towards students' academic problems and they keep in regular touch with their department faculty members and the Principal regarding the same. Their feedback has been very helpful in developing a students' support system. Regular meetings of students' representatives of the following committees are organized with the Principal, IQAC members, teaching, administrative and management bodies of the college to track the progress of these committees in making honest and genuine student support system available in the college for the fair progress students. Leaders of the Students' Union; Student representatives of the Proctors' Board; Student Members of the Student Welfare Association; Members of the Career Counselling & Academic Cell; Student Members of the Hostel Committee; Sports-Women; Canteen Committee; Medical Aid Committee; Grievance Cell; Cultural & Literary Programmes Committee. A grievance box is made available to the students outside the Grievance Cell office to define their problems and give their suggestions uninhibited and in writing which are weekly read by the Cell

and discussed with the Principal and IQAC members for their redressal. The P.G. students find a very conducive atmosphere in their respective departments and usually find full support from the faculty members in solving their academic, social and personal problems. The Principal's office is always open to the students without any restrictions and they interact with her with full confidence requesting support and advice for their requirements and problems.

The students are motivated to have group discussions on the class room lectures and to come out with difficulty issues on a collective basis after trying to mutually solve each others' problems in learning. Group library studies are also encouraged in which each student gets her own book issued on topics of study makes her notes and then the group mutually distributes them to make final better notes on the same. Open class room discussions, academic seminars and panel discussions are organized on a routine basis in each department. This helps the students in developing skills in interactive learning. Subject experts and members of various associations, industries, administrative services, NGOs and public representatives and are invited to deliver guest-lectures to promote behavioural collaborative learning along with independent theoretical learning among the students.

We have an independent Debating Society in the College headed by the HOD of the department of Philosophy who is assisted by other departments' faculty members. This Society organizes interdepartmental and intercollegiate university-level, regional and national debating competitions on topics of important contemporary national and global issues. Students in large numbers participate and come as curious audience in these programmes. This helps to a great extent in nurturing critical thinking and in developing a scientific temper among the students. Departmental exhibitions, fairs, poster and slogan competitions are organized which help in developing the creativity of the students.

**Following innovative processes have been adopted by the college in teaching and learning programmes:**

- a) Modern Infrastructure has been developed in the college to make teaching and learning convenient, interesting and easy for the teachers and students along the following lines:
  - (1) A Computer Centre with 100 systems.
  - (2) Language Labs for all the three languages, English, Hindi & Sanskrit, are further equipped and made user friendly for the students.
  - (3) Completely automated Library is with touch screen access.

- (4) A Research Lab on Molecular Taxonomy, Immunology, Cell Culture, and Parasitological & Biochemical Analysis in the Zoology Department.
  - (5) Water Testing & Adulteration Testing Labs in the Chemistry & Food Science & Quality Control Depts.
  - (6) High quality apparatus has been added to the Tissue Culture Lab of the Botany Dept.
  - (7) Fully equipped Dark room of the Home Science Lab with all necessary ICT-tools and Wi-Fi Connectivity.
  - (8) Latest testing tools and equipments in the Neuro-Psychology Lab.
  - (9) The Psychological Testing and Counselling Centre working for both students and teaching and administrative staff.
  - (10) New monuments and collections in the Archaeology & Museum lab established by History Dept.
  - (11) Desk Top Publication Lab in the Drawing & Ptg. Dept.
  - (12) Fully equipped self-sufficient Auditorium in the Music department.
  - (13) Entire college connected Wi-Fi facility as well as with internet facility with Firewall server, routers and wired networking in areas yet to be connected with the Wi-Fi.
- b) The Library has been modernized with following facilities:
- (1) Library automation and e-library facilities have been provided to the students -
    - (i) Entire Library Collection is on database and is interface.
    - (ii) Free internet access is provided to all students of the college.
    - (iii) E-learning centre with twenty computers with internet and internet connection for routine use of students.
    - (iv) On-line book reservation and book search are available.
  - (2) ICT tools are being used-
    - (i) Software for Library information & management.
    - (ii) Photocopier for all to get copy of the material required from the library.
    - (iii) Touch screen system for search of the books.
    - (iv) Twenty terminals for students & staff with Internet facility are provided.
  - (3) Library networking services with INFLIBNET & DELNET -  
College has institutional membership of INFLIBNET & DELNET and all staff members and students use this service onsite as well as offsite free of cost.
- c) ICT applications in Teaching-learning methods are being used:
- (1) Computer Centre / laboratories
    - (i) Centralized e-learning centre with internet connectivity and net-working with library.

- (ii) E-class room to conduct different lectures for certified and diploma courses running in Computer Centre.
- (2) Modernization of classrooms with audiovisual facilities / e-classrooms.
  - (i) Three class rooms, four lecture theatres and seminar hall and one big auditorium is equipped with Data Projector Computer and Internet Connectivity with full screen.
  - (ii) Two Lecture theatres are fitted with interactive e-board with internet facility for e-teaching.
- (3) ICT-tools for teaching-learning procured under CPE like CDS / Softwares / interactive multimedia tools etc., are being used by the individual departments as well.
  - (i) All the departments construct and deliver individual courses, delivery of power point, notes, submission of student work (file upload)
  - (ii) Departments uses Google, You-tube etc. sites for communication of learning materials, notes etc.
  - (iii) Departments conduct Video conferencing, group discussion with other countries on certain topics.
  - (iv) PG students of all the departments give their project present and seminar on Power Point.
  - (v) Every year Teaching – non teaching summer workshops are conducted to update and train them for their seat work and to develop working modules and e-lectures to be used in regular teaching online or offline.
  - (vi) Students and staff can excess Library catalogues in the departments also with the help of lane-networking.
  - (vii) On line objective Quiz are conducted by the department as in our University UG-final PG II and IV semesters are objective.
  - (viii) Departments of Zoology, Botany and Food Science etc. learn by seeing their rare slides and other teaching materials through projectors cameras to see the small details of the sample which are not visible otherwise.

The Academic & Career Counselling Cell calls counsellors from different and new avenues in the Global market for the students of different disciplines. The members of the cell bring cuttings of different advertisements of jobs/courses and put them on the notice board of the cell as well as on career corner in the library reading room. They arrange interviews/entrance tests conducted by different organizations for the selection for jobs. They guide the students appearing for interviews/presentations by applying on their own level.

The department of Psychology holds regular sessions of group and individual psychological counselling and mentoring of students. Students from other departments also are motivated to take part in these sessions and are free to

have consultations with the faculty members when the need arises. The department has kept separate hours and room for these consultations.

Sometimes when results are declared late by the university and the college is apprehensive of the limited time period for finishing the courses it requests the teachers to take extra classes and complete the courses. Every teacher gives written details of the progress of the process of her course-completion in the department's Diary which is signed by the HOD and the Principal periodically.

#### **2.4 TEACHER QUALITY:**

Our college is a girls' college so all the teaching faculty is female. We are a govt. aided affiliated college to the University so we do not have Professor designation for our teachers but all our permanent and self finance faculty members are Ph. D. holders. Only four teachers from our younger permanent staff are completing their Ph.D. research programmes.

We have well qualified faculty members. The permanent teachers are appointed by the UPHESC, Allahabad. While filling the vacant posts the management considers diversity, experience and merit set by UGC and State Govt. as some of the deciding factors. All vacant posts are filled by the temporary teachers before the teaching starts in each session.

We have 1 D.Lit., 21 Ph.D. and 6 M. Phil as Assistant Professors and 29 Ph.D. and 8 M. Phil as Associate Professors in the permanent category out of the total 54 permanent teachers We have 23 Ph.D. out of the 89 temporary teachers.

Teachers are encouraged to go for Orientation and Refresher courses. 5 newly appointed teachers went for Orientation programmes and 7 went for Refresher programmes. They participate in national and international seminars and conferences, present and publish papers, edit and author books in large numbers. During the last five years they attended around 562 national and 66 international seminars and conferences. They presented around 283 research papers in national and 38 research papers in international seminars during the period of 2010-2015.

The college organises national and international seminars and conferences with the assistance of various departments every year. We have organised 47 national, 33 regional and 13 international seminars, 113 workshops and conferences in the last five years. 19 national and 5 regional exhibitions were also organised and participated in by the Drawing Department.

National and international luminaries and dignitaries are invites to expose the students to the wide range of genius and intellect in the country. We have organised round 58 national and 3 international talks in our college.

## **2.5 EVALUATION PROCESS AND REFORMS:**

Following Examination Reforms introduced by the College since 2010-11 are still continuing successfully:

- (1) Use of continuous internal assessment methods by the college departments for giving 50% of the total marks to PG students (allotted to the colleges by the CCS University for internal assessment).
- (2) Use of Informative/summative assessment methodologies in giving 25% of total marks to the PG students.
- (3) For U.G. Students University uses the annual exam with marking system but we in our college try to assess their progress by using monthly test system, open house discussions and seminar participation methods.
- (d) For P.G. students along with marks based semester system paper presentation in departmental seminars, classes on research methodology and dissertation preparation are also taught so that they may score well in their external viva voce examinations.

Since the last four years copies of the internal exams are shown to the students, their signatures are taken on them and they are informed about the pattern of marking their answer sheets.

We have a grievance redressal cell headed by a senior faculty member with student representatives in it. They discuss and find solutions for students' problems on a regular basis. We have also placed a grievance box fixed outside the Chief Proctor's Office for the students to submit written complaints. These complaints are then discussed by the grievance cell with the Principal and the IQAC team to find amicable solutions to them. Students are then informed about the same in personal and group meetings.

If students are dissatisfied with their marks in the university results the university has an option for rechecking and recounting the marks in their copies by paying a nominal fee for the same. The students write applications, get them forwarded by the Principal and submit them in the University Results' department for redressal of their complaints.

The mark-sheets of the students are sent to the college by the university and are distributed to the students in the next academic session. The departments are also given the details of the external exams' results of the students of their departments.

## **2.6. STUDENT PERFORMANCE AND LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

The career counselling cell monitors the achievements of the students and holds placement interviews from time to time in the college campus to help students get jobs according to their interests and abilities. The teachers fill their self-appraisal forms each year and get their students'

feed-back forms filled in each session to assess their own performance vis-a-vis the students learning and their teaching levels and progress

Many students cleared NET. Around 75 students found jobs as teachers, 02 became Chartered Accountants, 1 was selected in U.P. Police, 1 became Company Secretary in VIPRO, 1 became NCC officer, 1 Senior Financial Analyst, New Delhi, 01 Senior Process Adviser Snap deal, 2 bank clerks and 1 became a successful entrepreneur.

**3.1 PROMOTION OF RESEARCH:**

IQAC motivates the faculty members and the students to organize and participate in research based seminars related to contemporary problems in their subjects and in the society as a whole. Most of the departments have opted for the dissertation course in place of essay writing for the PG Final year students. And because Research Methodology is a compulsory course in their 1<sup>st</sup> Year, Dissertation writing helps the students in developing interest in research and in preparing themselves technically for Ph.D. Research program after their Masters.

**3.2 RESOURCE MOBILIZATION FOR RESEARCH:**

5 students and 1 faculty member have received UGC, ICSSR, ICPR, Rajeev Gandhi Research Fellowships are the main funding agencies for research in our college during this period.

The Psychological Testing & Counseling Centre guides the students to select the right course. It also counsels the students on their socio-economic problems. The extension activities like women empowerment, Community Health & Nutrition, Environment awareness management, Psychological Testing & Counseling Centre and Extra Curricular & Cultural activities help in developing the personality, add to the qualification of the students and affect their employability.

**3.4: RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS AND AWARDS:**

Paper publication / presentation and organizing seminars / workshops of National and International level have increased. 279 research papers were published in national research journals; 19 papers were published in international research journals and around 58 articles were published in the proceedings of research seminars souvenirs.

1 e-book and 38 books were published by the faculty members. 8 chapters and 6 co-authored books were published. 1 book was translated, 22 books were edited and 38 editorial efforts in journals were made by the faculty members during the period of last five years.

76 Ph.D. scholars have completed their researches and 78 researches are ongoing in various departments.

**3.5 CONSULTANCY:**

The college has an official policy for structured for structured consultancy. It renders consultancy services to public and community. Different departments have 11 research collaborations, 11 linkages and 1 international linkage with various external agencies. Student Counselling Cell of the Psychology department, Community Development Cell of the Sociology Department, Plant Conservation Society of the Botany Department, the Fisheries research centre of the Zoology department, for example, have linkages with various NGOs and institutions. Senior faculty members are invited for consultancy by NGOs and various external agencies from time to time as experts.

They also are appointed as Subject experts, judges, Chairpersons, resource persons and controller exams and evaluation centres of the university.

**3.6 EXTENSION ACTIVITIES AND INSTITUTIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY:**

200 students participated in NSS events at the University level. 148 students participated in NCC events at the University level, 41 at the State level and 19

at the National level. No. of Extension activities organized per year by the University forum -2, by the College forum -10, by NCC -17 and by NSS -12. The details of the awards won, year wise for the last four years are given in the Extra Curricular Activities' Report of the SSR (in 3 b) in the department-wise report.

We have a Community Development Cell developed by the Sociology Department which organizes lectures, rallies, poster competitions, rural outreach programmes and encourages the students to associate with the weaker rural section of the society.

**Health Center / Fitness Centre:** There is a “Swasthya Kendra” which run under the guidance of Medical Committee, provides Allopathic & Homeopathic medicines to students as well as the teaching and non-teaching staff. It provides first aid in case of any injury. Students are taken to the near-by hospital under the supervision of a teacher in case of any serious problem

with the recommendation of the doctor. The Medical committee organizes talks by specialist doctors on girls' related problems. Camps for Dental checkup, Eye checkup, bone density, blood group, Hemoglobin etc. are organized. Medical committee takes remedial action whenever any new epidemic spreads like Swine Flu etc by distributing precautionary medicines to students, teachers & non-teaching staff.

**Guest House:** A fully furnished small Guest house for occasional stay of ladies only is available.

**Canteen:** College has a hygienically maintained canteen facility which provides tea, coffee etc along with fresh & cooked snacks.

**Grievance Redressal Cell:** Most of the problems of the students are solved by the teachers and heads of the departments who are the members of Grievance Redressal Cell.

**Proctor Board/Anti Ragging Cell:** Disciplinary problems are solved by Proctors & Chief Proctor.

**Hostel Committee:** is referred for all the problems related to Hostel.

**Academic & Career Counseling Cell:** The cell calls counselors from different and new avenues in the Global market for the students of different disciplines. The members of the cell bring cuttings of different advertisements of jobs/courses and put them on the notice board of the cell as well as on career corner in the library reading room. They arrange interviews/entrance tests conducted by different organizations for the selection for jobs. They guide the students appearing for interviews/presentations by applying on their own level.

**Psychological Testing & Counseling Centre:** Guides students in selecting the right courses and also counsels them on their personal & socio-economic problems.

**Cultural & Co-curricular Activities Cell:** For the over-all personality development of students the co-curricular & cultural activities cell organizes various cultural programs, competitions and inter university and are very essential, especially in a girls college. It helps in job placement also.

The Proctor Board has not encountered any issues pertaining to sexual harassment or ragging in the last five years. The students live in a very amicable and conducive atmosphere. There are rare cases when students from distant places bring mobiles to the college for keeping in touch with their families even when the college has banned mobiles inside college campus. But in such cases the mobiles are deposited in the Proctor Board and given back to the student with some fine and an apology application that she wouldn't repeat the mistake.

As it is a girls' college no issue of eve-teasing arises. And sufficient police picketing is provided by the administration for the safety and security of the girls outside the college campus.

Our college has a registered **Alumni Association**. It meets for its annual get together in the college. It distributes scholarships and free of cost Homeopathic medical aid on a daily basis. It also publishes its yearly journal *Raghunandani*. It distributes gifts to all the participants of the annual meet. Our Alumni Association is always invited to all our curricular activities. Following are the other activities through which it contributes in the institutional, academic and infrastructure development:

### 5.3 Student Participation and Activities:

The Principal's office is always open to the students without any restrictions and they interact with her with full confidence requesting support and advice for their requirements and problems.

### **6.1 INSTITUTIONAL VISION AND LEADERSHIP:**

Each department is given complete autonomy and delegation of power to execute the college mission in the academic and extra-curricular fields. The Principal simply defines the targets and the staff brings them to reality with their sub-planning and enterprise. This brings variety, develops initiatives, leadership talent and an innovative atmosphere in the college.

The senior PG and the final year UG student representatives are given various responsibilities and charge of departmental functions and college programmes which they fulfil with the help of their class fellows. This grooms them to take initiatives in future life and brings to the fore their latent leadership qualities. The college actually promotes a culture of participative management in both academic and non academic spheres. Our college always tries to define formally a stated quality policy. It develops it realistically on the basis of the resources and available infra-structure. It makes short term yearly plans called as college calendars and long term four to five yearly plans based on the expected future financial resources. It is already accredited with an A+ by the NAAC and enjoys a CE status and tries to make all out efforts in maintaining this position by utilizing the funds derived from various funding agencies.

Evaluation system is designed and developed by the University, Board of Studies but the college gives suggestions to the Board of Studies.

**(d)Research & Extension programmes:**

New equipments, Books & Journals will be required to increase output of research in terms of Ph.D. students, Publication of Papers organizing seminars & Workshops & conferences.

The extension activities like women empowerment, Community Health & Nutrition, Environment awareness management, Psychological Testing & Counseling Centre and Extra Curricular & Cultural activities will help in developing the personality, add to the qualification of the students and will affect their employability.

Exceptional results in all Academic, Research and co-curricular activities like sports, NCC, NSS and Cultural activities.

Link the college, college library and all its departments independently with other colleges of the CCS University on line.

**(f)Innovative programmes to nationalize/internationalize the college activities and programmes:**

1. Exchange of faculty between other States' Colleges in first year for exchange of talents & transfer it to other faculty and students.

2. Forming an information site on the website of each CE and NAAC accredited College for mutual guidance.

3. Giving opportunities to Colleges faculty members to go abroad for interacting / working with high graded institutions and to work as tutors through exchange programmes to propagate talent facilities, quality and innovation of one place to other in the field of teaching and research.

Our Principal makes it a point to meet the teaching and non-teaching staff

on a regular basis. She has not kept separate hours for meeting them nor do the employees need prior appointment from her to do so. She is always very keen to meet the students as well, shares pleasantries with them and is ever ready to give them a lending ear and promptly solves their problems. The in-charge of the grievance cell collects the written feedback given by the students from the grievance box and discusses them with her. She then gives proper feedback to the executive body of the college management and implements the changes after considering the suggestions given by them.

**Some of the resolutions made by the Management Council in the last year are as follows:**

Approving the building of four new class rooms, one toilet and one lift for the college

Accepting to sponsor national seminars

Reserving a considerable amount of Rs. 2-3 Lac (as per the need) from the Kripa Devi Trust for helping needy students; Approving the annual budget of the college; Approving the transfer applications of two faculty members; Approving applications of faculty members seeking Family Planning benefits. The college has begun the construction of rooms, lift and toilet and the work is expected to finish by December end.

Two national seminars sponsored by the management were organized, one by the Geography department and the other by the Education department. Applications have been collected from the economically weaker students and funds will be disbursed among them in this session.

The transfer applications of the two faculty members (one from the Pol. Sc. Dept. for Gorakhpur and the other from the Zoology Dept. for Ghaziabad) have been approved and the faculty members are now in the process of shifting to the other colleges in their native places. The applications of faculty members seeking Family Planning benefits have been signed and sent to the Higher Education Office in Allahabad.

Our affiliating university has a provision for according the status of autonomy to us. Our Principal has introduced the concept of 'Autonomy' to the teaching and non-teaching staff as well as to the Management Body. She is planning to organize a seminar on this topic. She will be requesting some officials from the UGC to Chair the programme so that they may put all the points clearly before the college personnel. She wants to apply for Autonomy only after getting acceptance from a majority of the staff members.

There is a rich tradition in our college of promoting the support staff to senior positions with added responsibilities and emoluments once they enhance their academic and administrative qualifications. But this also involves a formal open recruitment process by the management and Principal of the college inviting applications for the same. The wards of the support staff also get concessions in their fees by the Principal and management committee and teaching staff liberally lends them study material.

We have adopted a two tier evaluation process for the teaching faculty: by their peers & Principal and by the students.

The teachers maintain their diaries in which they fill their monthly teaching report which is submitted to the Principal via the HOD for monthly inspection.

They register their attendance by the bio-metric system and their online monthly attendance goes to the Regional Higher Education Office, Meerut as well as to the Higher Education Commission, Allahabad.

They also fill in the self-assessment forms every year and submit them to their HODs and Principal to be used at the time of their promotions for their performance appraisal.

We also hold bi-monthly meetings of HODs with the Principal and HODs' meetings with their department staff members to update each other and give regular feedback both ways.

The Management and the Principal have convinced the retiring eminent faculty members to continue teaching in the college as guest lecturers. HODs of the Political Sc. and Psychology departments have also joined under the govt. scheme of recruiting retired teachers till the age of 70. They are given very amicable and respectable treatment and motivated to continue their services till they can and they readily have agreed for the same.

**6.4 FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND RESOURCE MOBILIZATION:**

The college management executive body monitors effectively and efficiently the use of available financial resources. The Bursar along with the Finance (Accounts Officer) of the college conducts the internal audit and places it before the management executive and general body. The audit report with all the details is then given for external audit to a company (registered) for external audit. The audit is done yearly during the last months of an academic and financial session. No major audit objections have been made as the college uses the resources within the defined and pre-determined limits of the financial plan of each year. The major sources of funds for the college come from the sanctioned grants of five year plans, CPE, CE, UGC, ICSSR etc. Very rarely a situation of deficit arises and it is managed by the reserve and trust corpus fund.

1. The faculty members are being provided the latest info-technical facilities to adopt the best practices in teaching.
2. Every department is orienting its students in research techniques in their Masters' by training them in research methodology and dissertation programs

Students from all castes and communities are getting equal access to the college amenities and the students from the weaker sections of society are being given special facilities to cope up with the financial burden of learning through scholarships, fee- concessions, fee free-ships, earn-while-you-learn programs and book-lending.

IQAC motivates the faculty members and the students to organise and participate in research based seminars related to contemporary problems in their subjects and in the society as a whole.

Most of the departments have adopted the dissertation option in place of essay writing for the PG Final year students. And because Research Methodology is a compulsory course in their 1<sup>st</sup> Year, Dissertation writing helps the students in developing interest in research and in preparing themselves technically for Ph.D. Research program after their Masters.

**Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services:**

IQAC has made all efforts in utilizing the following facilities created by the college as effective student support systems: like health center, guest house, canteen, grievance-redressal cell; students counseling and guidance cell; placement cell etc.:

**Health Center / Fitness Centre:** There is a “Swasthya Kendra” which run under the guidance of Medical Committee, provides Allopathic & Homeopathic medicines to students as well as the teaching and non-teaching staff. It provides first aid in case of any injury. Students are taken to the near-by hospital under the supervision of a teacher in case of any serious problem with the recommendation of the doctor. The Medical committee organizes talks by specialist doctors on girls’ related problems. Camps for Dental checkup, Eye checkup, bone density, blood group, Hemoglobin etc. are organized. Medical committee takes remedial action whenever any new epidemic spreads like Swine Flu etc by distributing precautionary medicines to students, teachers & non-teaching staff.

**Guest House:** A fully furnished small Guest house for occasional stay of ladies only is available.

**Canteen:** College has a hygienically maintained canteen facility which provides tea, coffee etc along with fresh & cooked snacks.

**Grievance Redressal Cell:** Most of the problems of the students are solved by the teachers and heads of the departments who are the members of Grievance Redressal Cell.

**Proctor Board/Anti Ragging Cell:** Disciplinary problems are solved by Proctors & Chief Proctor.

**Hostel Committee:** is referred for all the problems related to Hostel.

**Academic & Career Counselling Cell:** The cell calls counsellors from different and new avenues in the Global market for the students of different disciplines. The members of the cell bring cuttings of different advertisements of jobs/courses and put them on the notice board of the cell as well as on career corner in the library reading room. They arrange interviews/entrance tests conducted by different organizations for the selection for jobs. They guide the students appearing for interviews/presentations by applying on their own level.

**Psychological Testing & Counselling Centre:** Guides students in selecting the right courses and also counsels them on their personal & socio-economic problems.

**Cultural & Co-curricular Activities Cell:** For the over-all personality development of students the co-curricular & cultural activities cell organizes various cultural programs, competitions and inter university and are very essential, especially in a girls college. It helps in job placement also.

We regularly try to inspire and motivate the students to become economically self dependent before marriage. The faculty members play the role of their friends, philosophers and guides and counsel them to become responsible individuals of the society.

**Future plans of the department:**

- The department plans to continue to impart all necessary information to the P.G. students online throughout the session.
- Each course's syllabus and chapters' outlines will be sent to them online.
- Information regarding each email sent to them would be given to them on their mobile numbers.
- Virtual internet classes will be organized for PG students with the help of PPP through OHP and internet facilities.
- Parliament's and Legislative Assemblies' ways of functioning would be taught to them through enactments of Lok Sabha and Assembly scenes in the form of skits and dramas to acquaint them with national and international political developments.
- They will be fully prepared, through debates, panel discussions and experts' lectures to critically analyze each political party of the country.
- Election process will be explained to both UG and PG students by organizing elections of class representatives - right from the process of filing of candidature forms, voting by secret ballot system, campaigning in classes, counting and finally declaration of results.
- All important National and International Days will be celebrated through seminars, guest lectures and debates.
- Tutorial, remedial classes will be taken for the academic assistance of the students and monthly tests will be organized for their self assessment.
- Entire academic year's academic and extra-curricular activities' schedule will be pre-announced with dates and activities to the students and sent to them on emails.

#### **Aim of NSS Programme-**

**BEST PRACTICES**

**A: Title of the Practice:**

**BEST PRACTICES IN TEACHING LEARNING & EVALUATION SYSTEM:**

**2. Goal:**

To make the entire teaching and learning system transparent and honest in the fulfillment of its objectives

To enthuse the teachers to deliver to the best of their abilities and to give an opportunity the students to grasp to the best of their capabilities

To obtain optimum results from their combined efforts

To create an atmosphere of trust between the students and teachers

To help the Principal achieve the set objectives of the college

To further enhance the reputation and image of the college in the city that it delivers what it promises

To achieve success in the mission of this college

**3. The Context:**

In a traditional set in any college of long standing the new methods of critical analysis of the teaching and learning capabilities creates a feeling of dissatisfaction in the beginning. The senior faculty members feel their abilities are being put to test now when they have delivered their best since a long period of their service.

The students also hesitate in giving their honest opinions about the teaching methods and the difficulties, if they are facing in them because the traditional atmosphere of teaching and learning does not give any space to questioning and giving opinions to elders.

But the new system of API and NAAC accreditation helped the college administration to convey to both the teachers and students that this new practice of self assessment and feedback by stakeholders should be taken in a healthy and positive manner as it is being adopted for the betterment of the institution and the staff ultimately.

**4. The Practice:**

We have adopted a two tier evaluation process for the teaching faculty: by their peers & Principal and by the students.

The teachers maintain their diaries in which they fill their monthly teaching report which is submitted to the Principal via the HOD for monthly inspection.

They register their attendance by the bio-metric system and their online monthly attendance goes to the Regional Higher Education Office, Meerut as well as to the Higher Education Commission, Allahabad.

They also fill in the self-assessment forms every year and submit them to their HODs and Principal to be used at the time of their promotions for their performance appraisal.

We also hold bi-monthly meetings of HODs with the Principal and HODs' meetings with their department staff members to update each other and give regular feedback both ways.

We have a very good tradition of organizing inter departmental debated and panel discussions to encourage interdisciplinary approach in learning and teaching.

They are also present in their departments and in the college vicinity for a minimum of 5 to 6 hours which ensures their regular interaction with the students outside their classrooms also. There is a very democratic and healthy relationship between the students and teachers and they openly discuss their academic difficulties, future course of action career-wise and family-wise as well.

We also have a tradition of holding welcome programs for the new students in the departments where new students are oriented with the college activities, facilities, expectations from them and their responsibilities. In these programs usually extra-curricular activities and competitions are also organized to allow the freshers to show their talents and choose the programmes of their interest for the rest of the years they would be in the college.

Class representatives are elected and they also keep a regular connection between the teachers and the students.

We also encourage the quick learners in the class to share their notes and explain the class lectures to the slow learners, usually making such groups of study, basically for the dissertation classes where both are made to prepare the questionnaires and work on the case studies together. This practice gives remarkable results and many times the slow learners outshine the quick graspers in their explanations and viva voce exams.

The students from the final years of UG and PG are requested to fill a questionnaire with multiple choice answers where they are asked to honestly rate the teaching, explaining motivating abilities of the teachers. We use these to assess our performances to make necessary changes where desired by the students in the next session.

##### **5. Evidence of Success**

The teachers and students with the passage of time have realized that this mutual system of assessment is, in fact, making it easier to teach and learn and a very trustworthy and positive atmosphere is being built in the institution.

The teachers ceremoniously distribute the feedback forms to the students of their classes in the mid session and in the last days of teaching. The students fill them without mentioning their names and the class monitors collect them and submit them to the teachers in a bundle. This way the students are not apprehensive of any repercussion and give their frank opinion regarding teaching and behavior of their teachers.

The teachers very openly discuss the remarks made in them with their colleagues and HODs and very healthily take the criticism, if any, and try to improve upon their weak points.

The students also perform to their best capacity in academics and extra-curricular activities because they are given ample opportunities to open up and express themselves in the programmes.

The weak students get sufficient boost up from the quick learners in their classes and the teacher support for them is exhaustive.

**6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

There was a great amount of dissatisfaction among teachers and extreme apprehension in students a decade ago when this system of self appraisal and teacher feedback was initiated. But not now! We do not face any problem in getting this mutual assessment done and it is now taken very positively. Teachers look forward to the remarks given by students about their teaching pattern, language and study material so that they may make amendments in their future study material selection and teaching methodology.

The students also have found the culture of mutual group study very fruitful and the fast learners are all the time very eager to assist the weak students. This gives a boost to their confidence level and also develops a feeling of empathy and social service in them.

It is very rare that any student is found neglected and bullied in the college due to her weak learning capabilities or her belonging to the weaker section. In the last decade the Proctor Board has never encountered a problem of this kind. A dress code has also helped in minimizing the projection of disparities in economic background of students.

**B.****1. Title of the Practice:****INITIATION OF SKILL DEVELOPMENT COURSES****2. Goal**

Our College is only for girls. Our aim is to make these girls economically self dependent. We, therefore, are trying to bring as many career oriented courses in our college as possible in wide variety of fields so that the students may take training in a subject of their choice to pursue a profession to their liking. These are add-on courses and this makes it easy for them to pursue their traditional UG / PG degrees simultaneously. These are Certificate, Diploma and Degree courses with varying durations which do not go beyond the duration and study hours of their traditional degree which makes it convenient for the students to pursue them without any rescheduling of their time and study hours.

**3. The Context**

Our college is situated in Western U.P. Majority of our students come from rural background where marriage of daughter is still the main priority and most important objective for parents. 90% of students have thus, the main aim of getting married as early as possible. Even girls who are coming from the city belong to families who do not consider job as the first priority for their daughters. The girls are sent to complete their graduation and post graduation while waiting for good grooms to marry them. This gives us a challenge to orient them with the importance of self-dependence. We try to sink in their minds the value of economic self-dependence which in the long run may help them get better partners and may also save them to some extent from the menace of dowry. The details of these courses are given in the college prospectus and those students who are not able to come in merit for regular UG / PG courses get an opportunity to pursue career oriented courses.

**4. The Practice**

A Special Study Centre for Women was opened by IGNOU in our college in 2013-14. It added three diploma courses: Diploma in Nutrition and Health Education (DNHE), Diploma in Early Childhood Care & Education (DECE) & Diploma in Creative Writing in English (DCE). It also started a Certificate course in Nutrition and Child Care (CNCC). This has given the students a wide range of flexibility in selecting courses for their post-intermediate UG programs. In 2013-14 two traditional courses B.A. and B. Com. were also started by IGNOU parallel to the CCS University UG programme which has served as a great help to students who wanted to study in our college but could not get admissions here due to a lower merit unavailability of their choice combinations. In IGNOU they found their choice subjects in B.A. and students with less % could also get a chance to get admission in B.Com. As the IGNOU Counsellors are appointed from the college teaching faculty only the students find it very satisfying and convenient to opt for these distance learning courses as their teachers are already known to them. In 2014-15

IGNOU has also allowed a PG course in Philosophy which our college does not have as a PG Programme. This gives the students an option to plan a teaching career in Philosophy as well. IGNOU also has given them the choice of choosing from two career-oriented PG courses one in Public Administration and the other in Rural Development. We have also started a NIIT Centre in our college since 2011-12. It gives Diploma and Certificate courses in IT on very subsidized fee. Students from economically weaker sections also get an opportunity to become computer savvy.

Two new career oriented programmes have been introduced through UGC Community College Programme along with the traditional university courses for students to choose from greater providing academic flexibility to them. They are 'Office Automation' and 'E-Governance' and BPO started in 2014-15 and 2015-16, respectively. Three more skill development UG courses have been started this year in 2015-16 through the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Kaushal Kendra Scheme. They are B. Voc. in IT; B. Voc. in Applied Clinical Psychology and B.Voc. in Yogic Science.

Two options in vocational courses have already been running in the college, one in Computer Application and the other in Food Science and Quality Control to choose as one option along with the other two for the UG Degree course in Arts and Science, respectively.

#### **5. Evidence of Success**

The seats allotted in these courses have always been full and demand is always more than supply which proves that the college was successful in convincing the students to choose from these vocational options also. Seats are already full in the latest added B. Voc. programme in Yogic Science. More students are choosing these courses in every new session which proves that the outgoing girls are getting better job opportunities with these degrees, diplomas and certificates. And information is spreading through word of mouth, gradually.

#### **6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

The basic problem encountered by us is of financial constraint of the students who usually come from economically weaker sections of society. Courses run by the affiliated bodies like NIIT have fixed fee structures. But we have tried to negotiate with NIIT to reduce the fee to an extent girls can pay. They also have initiated the scheme of partial payment in installments. It also becomes difficult to convince the parent of some students about the importance of such courses. They consider it a waste of time, energy and money because they feel these courses do not help them in finding better matches for their daughters. They feel that the problem of dowry remains as it is in finding good families for their daughters. Rather it raises the expectation level of their daughters so much that they are not able to adjust with the traditional circumstances.

#### **7. Notes (Optional)**

Whatever may be the apprehensions of the parents we have continued to

impress upon them and their wards to opt for these courses so that in all odd situations the girls may find a solid fall back of economic independence and may help their families also in managing financial affairs. The fact that the rush to these courses is ever increasing proves that the thought pattern and expectations of families, parents and girls are gradually changing for the better. We try to assist them in their fee payment schedule also to solve their financial restraints.
